LABOR PRICING AND REQUIREMENTS

Design Consultation: \$110.84 per hour

Design Consultants use computer technology and tools, such as Auto Cad, to create effective and customized solutions for customers. They are responsible for being familiar with current standard methods and practices within the audio visual industry. The Design Consultants role is integral for efficient audio visual design and integration.

Education and Experience: Design consultants must have a Bachelor's Degree and Training in the field of audio visual and control systems, or have minimum of five (5) years professional engineering experience. Master's Degrees may be substituted or up to two (2) years of experience.

Installation Technician II: \$ 65.49 per hour

Level II Installation Technicians are responsible for the installation of all technology equipment and control systems. They are also responsible for directing Level I Installation Technicians as to how to install equipment and use Level I installers as they see fit to complete the job at hand.

Education and Experience: Level II Installation Technicians must have a high school or technical school diploma with at least five (5) years of related work experience.

Installation Technician I: \$ 45.34 per hour

Level I Installation Technicians are responsible for aiding in installing all equipment with the help of and under the supervision of Level II or Level III installers.

Education and Experience: Level I Installation Technicians must have a high school or technical school diploma with one (1) year of related work experience.



Engineering: \$100.75 per hour

Engineers provide consultations with customers, the project manager, and sales representatives in design fully incorporated projects in conjunction with the customer's desires. It is their duty to make sure all necessary components are included when designing any job whether it be a CCS specified project or a project specified by the customer themselves. Engineers must work hand-in-hand with the sales representatives to actualize the customer's wishes for each design.

Education and Experience: Engineers must have a Bachelor's Degree with at least seven (7) years of related work experience.

Training: \$ 80.61 per hour

The Trainer is responsible for training on all interactive software and basic audio visual equipment functionality. It is the duty of the Trainer to create an understanding of all software and equipment for the customer so that the customer is easily able to use the technology with their own applications.

Education and Experience: The Trainer must have a Bachelor's Degree with at least one (1) year of related work experience.

Maintenance: \$ 85.64 per hour

It is the duty of the maintenance technician to service or contact the proper manufacturer for all damaged or non-working units under warranty. The Maintenance Technician will also service any customer who approaches CCS asking for service on a unit not covered by warranty.

Education and Experience: Maintenance Technicians must have a high school or technical diploma with at least one (1) year of related work experience and appropriate required certifications.

Programmer Level III: \$125.94 per hour

Level III Programmers program fully integrated control units with touch panels, full wall plate control, and switchers in order to control all technology within the room, including lighting, projection, sound, etc. Level III Programmers also handle all room separating and combining applications and AMX, Crestron, and Extron programming.

Education and Experience: Level III Programmers must have a Bachelor's Degree with at least seven (7) years of related work experience.

Programmer Level II: \$ 85.64 per hour

Level II Programmers program basic control unit's with simple wall plate controls to create centralized control for equipment including basic sound control programming.

Education and Experience: Level II Programmers must have a Bachelor's Degree with two (2)



years of related work experience or have the appropriate systems certifications with at least four (4) years of related work experience.

Programmer Level I: **\$ 65.49 per hour**

Level I Programmers provide basic level programming on site for non-control based applications. This programming includes: programming projectors, document cameras, and televisions.

Education and Experience: Level I Programmers must have at least a high school or technical diploma with one (1) year of related work experience.

Documentation: **\$ 80.61 per hour**

Accumulates required documentation related to projects as required in standard practices or customer specifications.

Education and Experience: Document writers must have a high school or technical school diploma and one (1) year of related work experience.

Project Manager: **\$ 80.61 per hour**

The project manager is responsible for the completion of all assigned projects. As manager, he/she serves as the project Point of Contract, performs site surveys, and develops manpower. The project manager works directly with customers, sales representatives, engineers. And technical teams to ensure the proper completion of all jobs.

Education and Experience: Project Managers must have a high school or technical diploma with at least five (5) years of related work experience in mechanical or electrical disciplines, three (3) years of which in audio, visual, or related discipline.
