OGG-TC1: ADVANCED CLOSE QUARTERS COMBAT (CQC) COURSE

This ten day advanced course of instruction in Close Quarters Combat (CQC) will provide operators with the required skills to conduct tactical operations in this challenging environment. This comprehensive course of instruction will progress from basic CQC theory and skills to advanced movement on complex targets using live fire. We will develop the small unit tactics and skill sets required to execute more complex and operationally challenging problems associated with controlling and securing larger structure spaces for hostage rescue operations and high value target operations. Capturing and/or recovery of critical infrastructure as well as securing sites for follow-on site exploitation will be a priority of this course of instruction. When the students complete this course of instruction they will be able to identify, maneuver, and engage threats in a very deliberate and accurate manner. Advanced CQC skills will focus on unity of effort, command and control and execution of tactical plans. This course is restricted to Department of Defense personnel and select Law Enforcement Agencies.

- Advanced CQC theory, tactics, techniques, and procedures.
- CQC movement as individuals, pairs, fire teams, troops, and squadrons.
- Dynamic and Deliberate CQC tactics.
- Advanced Mission Planning

- Manual and explosive breaching techniques/execution
- Critical Infrastructure Recovery Operations
- Vehicle Interdiction Operations
- Use and application of urban tactical mobility.
- Proper use of Containment Teams and Blocking Formations
- Plan and execute an assault on a deliberate, time-sensitive target.
- Other advanced classes
- Situational Training Exercises (SITEX)

OGG-TC2: ADVANCED SPECIAL OPERATIONS URBAN COMBAT COURSE

This ten day advanced course of instruction will provide operators with the required skills to conduct tactical operations in urban environments. This comprehensive course of instruction will progress from basic Special Operations Urban Combat (SOUC) theory and skills to advanced movement on complex targets using live fire. Capturing and/or recovery of critical infrastructure as well as securing sites for follow-on sensitive site exploitation will be a priority of this course of instruction.

When the students complete this course of instruction they will be able to identify, maneuver, and engage threats in a very deliberate and accurate manner. Advanced SOUC skills will focus on unity of effort, command and control and execution of tactical plans.

This course is restricted to Department of Defense personnel and select Law Enforcement Agencies.

Subject areas to include but not limited to:

- Introduction to SOUC theory, tactics, techniques, and procedures.
- SOUC Movement as individuals, pairs, fire teams, troops, and squadrons.
- Tactics for identification and appropriate level of force between hostile, unknown, and other non-hostile personnel.
- SOUC patrol formations.
- Contact drills for SOUC operations.
- Use and application of urban tactical mobility.
- Proper use of Containment Teams and Blocking Formations
- Coordinate organic maneuver elements during SOUC operations.
- Coordinate with other units on Joint and Combined operations.
- Coordinate fire support during SOUC operations.
- Plan and execute an assault on a deliberate, time-sensitive target.

- Other advanced classes
- Situational Training Exercises (SITEX)

OGG-TC3: Advanced Vertical Assault and Tactical Lead Climber Course of Instruction

This ten day course of instruction provides operators with the skills required to conduct vertical assault operations in multiple tactical environments ranging from cliffs and broken terrain to Urban and Maritime Vessels / Platforms. This training will cover all the equipment, skills, and tactics that an operator will require to conduct tactical operations in this challenging environment. The course will also cover planning and safety considerations when conducting tactical climbing operations. Students will get the opportunity to test their skills during multiple challenging scenarios. Each scenario is unique and will provide its own set of challenges. Training will take place during day and evening hours. Students will be expected to train in their tactical kit and scenarios will incorporate Non Lethal Training Ammunition and diversionary devices. Live fire and live breach training will be conducted providing the client schedules approved training locations and provides Range Safety Officer (RSO) support. This course stresses tactical application of all tasks and focuses on combat skill sets. This course is restricted to Department of Defense personnel and select Law Enforcement Agencies.

- Communications in tactical climbing operations.

- Ship Boarding Methods, Advanced Tactics
- Rooftop Team Emplacements
- Helicopter Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures;
- Transition from SOUC / MOUT operations to tactical climbing operations.
- Transition from Spec-Ops patrolling to tactical climbing operations;
- Transition from tactical climbing operations to CQC operations; 2, 4, and 6

- man entry exercises with non-lethal training ammunition (NLTA)
- Shipboard Vertical Assault Operations
 - Advanced Tactical Lead Climber Operations in a Maritime Environment.
 - Other Advanced Classes
 - Video support and analysis;

OGG-TC5: ADVANCED VERTICAL ASSAULT LEAD CLIMBER COURSE

This five week advanced course of instruction provides operators with the skills required to instruct and execute vertical assault operations in multiple tactical environments ranging from cliffs and broken terrain to Urban and Maritime Vessels / Platforms. Upon completion of this course the student will be qualified to serve as a designated subject matter expert (SME) for vertical assault / tactical climbing operations. This course is restricted to the Department of Defense and select Law Enforcement Agencies.

OGG-TC6: ADVANCED SOLDIERING SKILLS COURSE

This advanced course of instruction is designed for direct support operators integrating with Special Operations Forces. This four-week program is scenario based and runs as a “Live Problem” providing students the opportunity to advance their knowledge of special operations while improving their specialty skills at the same time. The full spectrum of skills are covered to prepare each student for the challenges of today’s battlefield. Live fire and advanced Non-Lethal Training Ammunition (NLTA) scenarios are heavily emphasized. Situational Training Exercises are conducted in both rural and urban environments providing the students with the required skills to integrate with today’s Special Operations Forces. This advanced course is restricted to Department of Defense personnel.

OGG-TC7: ADVANCED SOLDIERING SKILLS COURSE at OGG New Hampshire Site
