

Under no circumstance shall this include construction (Construction is defined as construction, alteration, or repair of buildings, structures, or other real property, as defined by Federal Acquisition Regulation 36.102).

Contractors may subcontract any ancillary services ordered under this Special Item Number, unless specifically prohibited by the contracting officer issuing the order against the Multiple Award Schedule contract. Contractors are responsible for insuring that the scope of work is completed and all warranties are honored. Subcontractors must be licensed and bonded. Compliance with all local laws, regulations, and ordinances are the responsibility of the prime contractor. The prime contractor shall accept full responsibility and liability for all work performed by subcontractors, at any level or tier. The Government reserves the right to apply liquidated damages whenever the required delivery date is not met. Contractors are required to maintain insurance in accordance with Clause 52.228-5, Insurance – Work on a Government Installation. Agencies' Scope of Work will inform the Contractor of the Required insurance amounts. Clause 52.228-5 is made part of this contract by reference. In addition, the contracting officer for the ordering agency may insert any agency unique requirements for the job, including employee suitability determination requirements (security checks), into the scope of work.

AGENCIES MUST FULLY DEFINE THE SCOPE OF REQUIRED SERVICES (INCLUDING INSURANCE AMOUNTS) AND OBTAIN PRICE QUOTATIONS FROM SCHEDULE CONTRACTORS FOR THAT SCOPE. ACCURATE DEFINITION OF THE SCOPE IS ESSENTIAL IN ORDER TO FACILITATE REALISTIC QUOTATIONS. THE AGENCY WILL DETERMINE THE BEST VALUE TO THE GOVERNMENT BASED ON THE QUOTATIONS RECEIVED. AGENCY ORDERS SHOULD DETAIL ANY REQUIRED SERVICES AS A SEPARATE LINE ITEM.

SIN 246-51 Installation requiring Construction

INCLUDES: Installations which require construction, as defined in FAR 36.102.

Note: Ancillary services involving installation which do not meet the definition of construction as defined in FAR 36.102 shall be covered under SIN 246-50.

Contractors may subcontract installation under this special item number, unless specifically prohibited by the contracting officer issuing the order against the Multiple Award Schedule contract. Contractors are responsible for insuring that the scope of work is completed and all warranties are honored. Subcontractors must be licensed and bonded. Compliance with all local laws, regulations and ordinances are the responsibility of the prime contractor. The prime contractor shall accept full responsibility and liability for all work performed by subcontractors, at any tier or level. The Government reserves the right to apply liquidated damages whenever the required delivery is not met. All Construction Contract Clauses and Davis-Bacon regulation as shown in the solicitation will apply. In addition, the contracting officer for the ordering agency may insert any unique requirements for the job, including employee suitability determination requirements (security checks), into the scope of work.

It is the agency's responsibility to define the scope of work required for installation, and to comply with the Construction Contract Clauses and Davis-Bacon regulations. Performance clauses will be modified for each job by the requiring agency. Contractors shall quote prices based on the agency's scope of work. Quotes shall detail separate line items for product, ancillary services and/or installation involving construction. All payments and orders must be placed with the prime contractor. All construction work must be guaranteed for any defect in workmanship and materials. The agency will determine the best value to the Government based on the quotations received. The contracting officer for the ordering agency shall be responsible for obtaining pricing information and the negotiation and award of the installation required by the scope of work. The contracting officer for the ordering agency shall be responsible for determining the prices is fair and reasonable. The ordering agency is responsible for all administration of orders issued under this Special Item Number. Agency orders should detail installation requiring construction as a separate line item.

WHEN CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION OR REPAIR OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS OR PUBLIC WORKS IS INVOLVED UNDER THIS SIN, ALL RELEVANT CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT CLAUSES AND DAVIS-BACON ACT PROVISIONS WILL APPLY. AWARDED CONTRACTS WILL CONTAIN SPECIFIC CLAUSES PERTINENT TO THIS SPECIAL ITEM NUMBER.

OFFERORS MAY ONLY OFFER THIS SPECIAL ITEM NUMBER IN CONJUNCTION WITH SYSTEMS OFFERED UNDER THIS SCHEDULE. THE PRINCIPAL PURPOSE OF THIS SCHEDULE IS FOR THE PURCHASE OF ALARM AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS/FACILITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS.

SIN 246-53 Energy Savings Performance Contracts (ESPC)

CAPITAL LEASES MAY BE PERFORMED UNDER THIS SIN FOR A PERIOD NOT TO EXCEED 25 YEARS FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF ENERGY SAVINGS PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- Agencies utilizing this SIN for Energy Savings Performance Contracts are required to have obtained any required approvals under 42 USC 8287.
- Annual Energy Audits are required. The audit is required to be performed utilizing the North American Measurement and Verification Protocol. Steps in the audit process include: Baseline Verification, Post-Installation Verification, and regular Interval Post-Installation Verification. Required energy audits shall be included in the lease payment quoted by Siemens Building Technologies in response to the agency's scope of work.
- Terms and Conditions of the Performance Guarantee will be specified by Siemens Building Technologies in response to the agency's scope of work. This guarantee shall, at a minimum, provide that the contractor is responsible for maintenance and repair services for any energy related equipment installed under this agreement (including computer software systems). **The contractor shall guarantee a minimum amount of energy savings per year.** Shall the minimum savings amount not be met, the difference shall be paid to the agency within 30 days of the end of the yearly period.

- Aggregate annual payments made by an agency to both the utility and energy savings performance contract may not exceed the amount that the agency would have paid for utilities without an energy savings performance contract during the life of the agreement.
- Guaranteed savings must exceed the debt service requirements.
- If the cancellation ceiling exceeds \$10,000,000, the agency shall provide written notification to Congress in accordance with the National Energy Conservation Policy Act Requirements (42 USC 8287).
- Customer agencies shall have the right to place additional requirements within the scope of this contract in their statement of work. Any maintenance agreement performed under this provision shall be effective for the duration of the lease, unless otherwise specified by the agency in their scope of work. The agency shall obtain title to the equipment following the final lease payment
- The agency shall have the option of “buying out” the lease at any period during the lease. The buy-out amount shall be the remaining residual value.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

This lease is for the number of years stated in the delivery order. The Government has the right to terminate this contract for convenience or default in the accordance with Federal Acquisition regulation Part 49.

In the event that the lease is terminated for lack of funding, the Government may purchase the leased equipment for the residual value within 30 days of receipt of invoice from the vendor or may elect not to purchase the leased equipment. Alternatively, if the equipment is not purchased, the Government shall permit the lessor to enter the premises and remove all or any portion of the leased equipment the lessor may choose. Any equipment not removed shall become the property of the Government.

CANCELLATION CEILING

Should the lease be completely terminated for convenience (for any reason other than the aforementioned lack of funding), the Government shall purchase the leased equipment for the residual value. The residual value shall be determined by utilizing the standard payments function on the commercially available spreadsheet program (e.g. Lotus 1-2-3, Excel, etc.) The contractor shall provide the Government a table detailing the yearly estimated residual value based on the interest rate quoted to the Government at the time of the Statement of Work.

In the event of a partial termination for convenience, the Government and the lessor shall negotiate a reasonable compensation to the lessor for the residual value of the leased equipment included in the terminated portion of the lease.

PERFORMANCE DELAYS

Siemens Building Technologies (Siemens) shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of Siemens and without its fault or negligence beyond the reasonable control of Siemens and without its fault or negligence such as, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine, restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. Siemens shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement of any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence. Any delays caused by the Government in its contractual capacity shall be dealt with in accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation 42.13. Notwithstanding this provision, Siemens shall not be entitled to any adjustment in the term or price of the lease arising from delays caused by the Government unless a detailed Critical Path Method Schedule was provided to the Government at the start of the project and updated regularly by Siemens.

ORDERING PROCEDURE

- Contractor performs feasibility analysis.*
- Contractor performs preliminary energy audit.*
- Contractor and Agency enter into agreement for the Contractor to perform a detailed energy audit. ** The procedures and price of this audit shall be conducted in accordance with CSP-1 Commercial Sales Practices Format (Number 4).
- Contractor shall present detailed project design, showing the proposed scope of work. In addition to the design, the Contractor shall present a proposed price for the work to be performed. The price shall consist of product prices, and labor prices (to be negotiated in accordance with CSP –1 Commercial Sales Practices Format). The monthly payment shall be calculated by the Contractor utilizing the contractual rate of interest.
- Upon agreement of the price and scope of work, a delivery order shall be issued by the ordering agency.
- Upon acceptance of the work, the guarantee period shall begin.

*Agency will determine which contractor offers the best value after these two steps. No cost to the agency for these services.
**Cost of the detailed energy audit may be paid for by the agency or rolled into the lease agreement.
