May design and conduct tests and analyze results of tests or outputs intended for Customer. Mathematical and statistical methods may be used. Will make recommendations based on findings. May perform work in which the principles, theories and general body of knowledge of electrical, mechanical, or other engineering discipline is required. Contributes subject matter expertise and advice to the customer at a level that is attained via a related technical education.

**Analyst:** Provides expert analytical and/or scientific solutions for highly complex technical/scientific matters. May analyze program activities, such as acquisition or program planning, program “should cost” analyses, financial management, cost analysis, and other tasks related to Government programs, weapon systems, or similar complex programs. May analyze and format information developed and used to evaluate a Government program/weapon system/ similar complex program. May develop, plan, coordinate and integrate systems-related



requirements to support operational needs. May develop, gather, and organize program-related information. Contributes subject matter expertise and advice to the customer at a level that is attained via a related technical education.

May conduct studies, technical assessments, system analyses, and architectural-level analyses to determine system performance and effectiveness. May formulate and use mathematical models or representations to conduct systems analysis. Contributes subject matter expertise and advice to the customer at a level that is attained via a related technical education.

Establishes budgets, forecasts, manpower, equipment and supply needs for assigned area of responsibility.
