### *Sr. Project Manager*

Responsible for overall success of contract and program management. Coordinate project planning including staffing, budget, safety and administration. Provide direction and technical guidance to project managers and field supervisors in support of field activities. Ensure client and project goals are established and met. Prepare proposals and bids. Implement corporate programs to ensure compliance by staff. Oversee health and safety performance.

### *Project Manager*

Manage site specific projects to successfully provide quality, cost effective, and safe services and ensure project goals and schedules are met. Develop work plans and strategies; schedule personnel and resources; supervise project staff; implement site health and safety; prepare/maintain project documentation and reports; and assure compliance with federal, state, local and company regulations. Act as the primary contact with the client to communicate site activity and progress.

### *Chemist*

Support project requirements through application of technical expertise. Experience with Federal Regulations, i.e. RCRA, CERCLA, TSCA, Clean Water Act, and NPDES. Experience in hazardous waste management. Duties may include development and implementation of site sampling protocols, mapping, coordinating analytical requirements, researching treatment, recycling and disposal options, and coordinating hazardous waste disposal. Prepare technical reports.

### *Environmental Scientist*

Support project requirements through application of technical expertise. Experience with Federal Regulations, i.e. RCRA, CERCLA, TSCA, Clean Water Act, and NPDES. Experience in hazardous waste management. Duties may include development and implementation of site sampling protocols, mapping, coordinating analytical requirements, researching treatment, recycling and disposal options, and coordinating hazardous waste disposal. Prepare technical reports.

### *Health & Safety Supervisor*

Responsible for the application of the company health & safety program at the project level. Possess thorough knowledge of federal, state and local safety regulations. Develop site safety plans that address safety and contaminant exposure hazards. Ensure compliance with OSHA and company requirements, including employee training certification. Perform safety audits at work sites. Assist the Corporate Health and Safety Manager with the development, implementation, and review of company policies and procedures and the evaluation of the effectiveness of the program.

### *Administrative Assistant*

Provide office administrative and secretarial support. Duties include maintenance of project files, data entry and maintenance, accounts payable and receivable, filing, and answering phones. Competent in operating office machinery and computer programs, i.e. Word, Excel, and PowerPoint.

### *Foreman / Response Supervisor*

Manage field crews during hazardous material removal operations. Possess understanding and extensive experience in site operations, remediation and mitigation methods, equipment capabilities and waste disposal. Ensure project goals are clearly identified and regulatory compliance is maintained. Prepare and implement site safety plans to ensure company safety and quality goals are met. Schedule personnel, equipment and materials and establish work assignments. Document site activities by completing required paperwork. Communicate with management and client on project status.

### *Truck Driver, SCA Code 23440*

Operate a variety of trucks and truck/trailer combinations, including stake beds and box vans, for the movement of equipment, materials and waste. Maintain applicable commercial driver's license and endorsements. Experience with correct loading / securing procedures and manifesting. Experience in remediation and mitigation methods and fully trained in removal activities per OSHA requirements. Duties include mobilize/demobilize equipment and material, establish containment, remove hazardous materials and perform other site-specific remediation activities. Has thorough knowledge of company health & safety and performance procedures to ensure site safety is maintained. Assist site supervisor in determining resource needs. May be required to train employees and coordinate site specific activities.

### *Technician I, SCA Code 23470*

Perform labor for executing field services as directed by management or higher grade technicians. Duties include mobilize/demobilize equipment and material, establish containment, remove hazardous materials and perform other site-specific remediation activities. Has knowledge of company health & safety and performance procedures to ensure site safety is maintained.
