### Labor Category Descriptions

#### Environmental Principal

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** A minimum of fifteen years of applicable experience is required, of which five years must be in a senior level management capacity.

**Minimum Education:** Bachelor's degree in a related field.

**Functional Responsibilities:** Coordinates scope development for major environmental projects. Ensures that high professional and technical standards are implemented and maintained throughout the firm. Provides technical consulting assistance on special projects for environmental assessments and strategies. Provides training, mentoring and environmental conceptual models to unit leaders. Monitors

#### Environmental Field Technician

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** A minimum of 5 years experience is required.

**Minimum Education:** Associates degree in a related field.

**Functional Responsibilities:** The Field Technician provides technical, managerial, and administrative support, such as creating reports, for analysis, requirements development, and implementation for environmental issues. Will conduct routine inspections, collect samples and conduct field and laboratory tests. Has a great understanding of all applicable procedures, policies, and work methods associated with the project.

#### Geologist

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** A minimum of 4 years of applicable experience is required. Must be a Registered Geologist or a Professional Geologist.

#### Geohydrologist (Senior Geologist)

**Minimum/General Experience:** A minimum of 10 years of applicable experience is required. Must be a Registered Geologist or a Professional Geologist.

**Minimum Education:** MS in Geology or a related field.

**Functional Responsibilities:** Performs independent field work and gathers all types of field data pertinent to the assigned project. Performs geological, hydrogeologic, and hydrochemistry analyses. Develops materials and completes reports on finished field work. Prepares geologic reports (e.g. Remedial Investigation reports, groundwater monitoring reports, ect.) with some technical oversight. Prepares and delivers technical papers. Assists in preparation of proposals and cost estimates to clients and in soliciting bids from subcontractors/suppliers. Supervises one or more lower-level Geologists or Technicians, including reviewing geologic analyses assessments, and other types of reports. Serves in an advisory capacity to senior management on specific geology-related matters.



### **Senior Environmental Planner**

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** Prior work experience should be primarily in the area of community and natural environmental impacts as a result of construction and related development activities. The position requires 5 to 10 years prior applicable experience and recognizable technical expertise.

**Minimum Education:** Masters of Science in related field. The position also requires certification from the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP).

**Functional Responsibilities:** Technical responsibilities include project site “walk-throughs”, collection of pertinent field, lab, and published data, and interpretation and reporting by means of the preparation of technical reports. The environmental Planner shall be familiar with a variety of environmental planning documents including but not necessarily limited to Environmental Impact Statements, environmental Assessments and Categorical Exclusions. The planner will be expected to engage and interact with various local, state and federal agencies relevant to the planning process.

### **Environmental Planner**

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** Prior work experience should be primarily in the area of community and natural environmental impacts as a result of construction and related development activities. The position requires 1 to 5 years prior applicable experience and recognizable technical expertise.

**Minimum Education:** Bachelors of Science in related field.

**Functional Responsibilities:** Technical responsibilities include project site “walk-throughs”, collection of pertinent field, lab, and published data, and interpretation and reporting by means of the preparation of technical reports. The environmental Planner shall be familiar with a variety of environmental planning documents including but not necessarily limited to Environmental Impact Statements, environmental Assessments and Categorical Exclusions. The planner will be expected to engage and interact with various local, state and federal agencies relevant to the planning process.

### **Environmental Professional**

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** The position of Environmental Professional requires a diverse background in the Environmental Consulting field with an emphasis on Phase I and II Environmental Site Assessments (ESAs), hazardous materials surveys, and related disciplines. The position requires a minimum of 5 to 10 years of applicable experience and recognizable technical expertise.

**Minimum Education:** Bachelors of Science or Engineering level.

**Functional Responsibilities:** Environmental Professional shall be assigned project responsibilities ranging from staff management, scope development, budget and proposal preparation, short list interviews, production work, project/client meetings, and project site visits. The Environmental Professional actively participates in and manages day-to-day assignments including planning, staffing, and execution of projects. Experience with scope development and execution of a variety of projects is desirable.

### **Principal Investigator**

**Minimum/General Experience:** At least 8 years of experience in positions of oversight of archaeological projects including Phase I pedestrian surveys, Phase II National Register of Historic Places eligibility testing, and Phase III data recovery investigations.

**Minimum Education:** Masters degree in archaeology (prehistoric and/or historic)

**Functional Responsibilities:** Oversees the planning and execution of archaeological projects from the permit application to the completion of all permit-associated tasks. Proven experience in the production of Scopes of Work (SOW) and/or Research Designs (RD), detailed knowledge of the applicable state and federal regulations applicable to cultural resource compliance archaeology, and the management of all phases of archaeological investigations.

### **Project Archaeologist Historic/Prehistoric**

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** At least 5 years of experience in overseeing archaeological projects including Phase I pedestrian surveys, Phase II National Register of Historic Places eligibility testing, and Phase III data recovery investigations and the successful completion of Antiquities Permit associated tasks.

**Minimum Education:** Masters degree in archaeology (prehistoric and/or historic)

**Functional Responsibilities:** Oversees the planning and execution of archaeological pedestrian survey, NRHP eligibility testing, and data recovery projects. Proven experience in the execution of all SOW- and RD-defined archaeological tasks while managing small to large and short to extensive field investigations. Capable of conducting specialized analyses as well as writing technical reports and compiling the products of multiple specialized analyses into a technical report that meets State Historic Preservation Officer and Secretary of Interior guidelines.

### **Field and Laboratory Technician**

---

**Minimum/General Experience:** At least 3 years of experience in conducting field work and/or processing archaeological collections in laboratory settings. Minimum laboratory skills shall include the post-field processing of artifacts through washing, drying, sorting into basic analytical categories, and the processing of artifact collections for detailed analysis by specialists and subsequently for permanent curation.

**Minimum Education:** Bachelors degree in anthropology

**Functional Responsibilities:** Completes archaeological field investigations and/or laboratory artifact processing tasks typically performed during archaeological survey, NRHP testing and data recovery investigations. Tasks may minimally include pedestrian survey –associated shovel testing, the excavation of 1-x-1 meter test units according to standard archaeological excavation procedures, and the completion of field notes and associated record keeping as well as the scaled-mapping of artifacts and features.
