This Agreement (“Agreement”) is made by PolicyMap, Inc (“PolicyMap”), a Pennsylvania nonprofit, tax exempt limited liability company, and an Ordering Activity, which is an entity entitled to order under GSA Schedule contracts as defined in GSA Order ADM 4800.2H, as may be revised from time to time (“Subscriber”), and consists of one or more Order Forms signed by the parties, and these Terms and Conditions (collectively, the “Agreement”). This Agreement and the terms of use (the “Terms of Use”) on PolicyMap’s website and services (collectively, the “Service”) shall govern the terms and conditions of Subscriber’s access to and use of the Service, including the use of the data and other information available on the Service. The Service may be added to or modified by PolicyMap during the term of this Agreement.

1. LICENSE AND PERMITTED USES

- 1.1. - 1.3. If purchasing a Standard or Premium Subscription, Subscriber will identify each user (each, an “Authorized User”) in the Order Form or by any other process identified by PolicyMap. 5.2 In the event that either party believes that the other party materially has breached any obligations under this Agreement, or if PolicyMap believes that the Subscriber has exceeded the scope of the license granted by this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall notify the breaching party in writing. The breaching party shall have ten (10) calendar days from the receipt of notice to cure the alleged breach and to notify the non-breaching party in writing that cure has been effected.

6. GENERAL

6.1 Neither party shall assign its rights, duties, or obligations under this Agreement to any person or entity, in whole or in part; provided however that either party may assign no less than all of its rights under this Agreement to a successor entity as a result of a merger, acquisition or re-organization in accordance with FAR 42.1204. Any permitted assignment shall be effective upon receipt of written notice by the non-assigning party.

6.2 If any provision of this Agreement is found by any court or other tribunal of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity of such provision shall not affect the other provisions of this Agreement, and all provisions not affected by such invalidity shall remain in full force and effect. Either party's failure to exercise or enforce any right or provision of this Agreement will not be deemed to be a waiver of such right or provision.

6.3 United States federal law shall govern this Agreement, without reference to any conflicts of laws principles The U.N. Convention on Contracts for the International Sales of Goods shall not apply to this Agreement.

1. INSPECTION/ACCEPTANCE

The Contractor shall only tender for acceptance those items that conform to the requirements of this contract. The ordering activity reserves the right to inspect or test any software that has been tendered for acceptance. The ordering activity may require repair or replacement of nonconforming software at no increase in contract price. The ordering activity must exercise its post acceptance rights (1) within a reasonable time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and (2) before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the software, unless the change is due to the defect in the software.

2. ENTERPRISE USER LICENSE AGREEMENTS REQUIREMENTS (EULA)

The Contractor shall provide all Enterprise User License Agreements in an editable Microsoft Office (Word) format.

3. GUARANTEE/WARRANTY

- a. Unless specified otherwise in this contract, the Contractor's standard Commercial guarantee/warranty as stated in the contract's commercial pricelist will apply to this contract. (See PolicyMap, Inc - Software License Terms and PolicyMap, Inc - Data License Agreement on pages #11 and 44 of #59)
- b. The Contractor warrants and implies that the items delivered hereunder are merchantable and fit for use for the particular purpose described in this contract. If no implied warranties are given, an express warranty of at least 60 days must be given in accordance with FAR 12.404(b)(2)
- c. Limitation of Liability. Except as otherwise provided by an express or implied warranty, the Contractor will not be liable to the ordering activity for consequential damages resulting from any defect or deficiencies in accepted items.

- b. When acquired by the ordering activity, commercial computer software and related documentation so legend shall be subject to the following:

Statement on Data Security:

PolicyMap (which includes all Services including site licenses), and all associated data as of the Effective Date are hosted on Amazon's Web Services infrastructure, at a hosting facility located in Northern Virginia. Our database development group maintains the security of the Service production application and all associated data via firewall facilities provided by the Amazon Web Service. Only ports 80 and 443 are publicly accessible, which is consistent with standard implementation of World Wide Web protocols. The software delivering data from these ports is routinely scanned by Security Metrics for PCI compliance or compliance with similar metrics.

Administrative access to servers hosting the Service at the hosting provider is currently done through the Secure Shell program (also known as SSH) as of the Effective Date, which implements encrypted communication between the administrator and the machine being administered. The SSH server is the only mechanism for data to be uploaded to PolicyMap systems at the hosting provider, and also the only mechanism for direct administration of the hosting provider's environment. PolicyMap Data License Agreement

Terms and Conditions

This Data License Agreement (this “**Agreement**”) is entered into by and between PolicyMap, LLC (“**PolicyMap**”) and an Ordering Activity, which is an entity entitled to order under GSA Schedule contracts as defined in GSA Order ADM 4800.2H, as may be revised from time to time (“**Subscriber**”), as of the date stated on the Order Form (the “**Effective Date**”), and consists of the Order Form, these Terms and Conditions and the GSA Schedule contract. The parties, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows.

1. **Definitions.** For purposes of this Agreement, the following terms shall have the meanings set forth below:

1.1. “**Data**” shall mean the geographic and related data to be provided to Subscriber by PolicyMap pursuant to this Agreement, as more fully described in the applicable Order Forms.

1.2. “**Deliverable**” shall mean any modifications to the PolicyMap code that the parties agree will be made as stated on an Order Form.

1.3. “**Order Form**” shall mean a written document signed by an authorized representative of each party.

1.4. “**Services**” means the services provided by PolicyMap pursuant to this Agreement, including the provision of Data and Deliverables to Subscriber.

1.5. “**Subscriber Site**” shall mean the domain name or uniform resource locator (or “**URL**”) from which the Users are permitted to access and use the Data. The Subscriber Site must be password-protected. If the Subscriber Site is not identified in the Order Form, then Subscriber will identify the Subscriber Site URL to PolicyMap within a reasonable time after the Effective Date.

1.6. “**Users**” shall mean those individuals who are authorized by Subscriber to access and use the Subscriber Site.

2. **License Grant, Ownership and Services.**

2.1. **License Grant.** In consideration of and upon receipt of the Fees, PolicyMap hereby grants to Subscriber a temporary, non-exclusive, non-sublicensable, non-transferable, worldwide right and license (the “**License**”) to (a) use, reproduce, store, distribute, format, transmit, and display the Data solely on the Subscriber Site and (b) allow Subscriber’s Users to use (and, if necessary, access, store and display) the Data as delivered or otherwise provided on the Subscriber Site.

2.2. **Ownership.** PolicyMap and its licensors own and will retain all right, title and interest in and to the Data and to all Deliverables, and Subscriber obtains only those rights expressly set forth herein. Nothing in this Agreement will prohibit PolicyMap from (i) using the Data or any Deliverable, in whole or in part, in any manner (including on behalf of third parties, whether or not for a fee), (ii) modifying the Data or any Deliverable, or (iii) providing the Data or any Deliverable (directly or indirectly, in whole or in part) to third parties, whether or not for a fee.

2.3. **Restrictions.** To the maximum extent permitted by law, neither Subscriber nor its Users will: (a) modify, reverse engineer, decompile, or disassemble any software or other Deliverables provided as part of the Services; (b) rent, lease, loan, sell, sublicense, distribute, transmit, or otherwise transfer the Services or Subscriber's right to provide access to the Website to any third party; or (c) except as otherwise provided herein, resell access to or use of the Services, or otherwise charge a fee to third parties solely for access to or use of the Services. Any and all rights not expressly granted by PolicyMap to the Subscriber under this Agreement are reserved by PolicyMap.

2.4. **Services.** Any hosting, support and related Services that may be provided pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to the Exhibit attached to these Terms and Conditions, entitled "Platform Availability, Support and Data Security."

2.5. **Additional Data and Services.** If Subscriber chooses to license additional Data or pursue development beyond the scope initially contemplated by this Agreement, the parties may negotiate in good faith to enter into an additional or revised Order Form to govern the terms of such Data license or development.

2.6. **Trademarks.** All trade names, marks, logos, page headers, custom graphics, button icons and domain names (collectively, "Trademarks") of each party remain the Trademarks of such party. Each party grants the other party sufficient rights to use the other party's Trademarks solely to implement this Agreement.

3. **Confidentiality.** Subscriber understands and agrees that all non-public information of PolicyMap received by Subscriber, constitutes confidential and proprietary

information of PolicyMap. Subscriber agrees that it will not disclose PolicyMap's confidential information to any third parties, nor to any employees or independent contractors not having a need to know the confidential information, without the prior written consent of PolicyMap.

4. **Acknowledgements and Warranties.**

4.1. **Acknowledgements by Subscriber.** Although PolicyMap believes the Data to be reliable, PolicyMap does not guarantee either the results to be achieved by use of the Data or any information or materials produced through the use of the Data or the accuracy, completeness or reliability of the Data or any other information. Such Data is provided without regard to Subscriber's or any User's particular circumstances and PolicyMap shall not be liable for any damages arising out of any inaccuracy therein. Any decision to use the Data or any information or opinions derived through such use is the sole responsibility of Subscriber; PolicyMap shall have no liability in connection therewith. Subscriber further acknowledges that in the course of performing the Services contemplated by this Agreement, PolicyMap's third party service providers may perform certain of the services on PolicyMap's behalf (e.g., hosting, software development and technical support).

4.2. **By the Parties.** Each party represents, warrants and covenants that: (a) it is a legal business entity duly organized and validly existing in good standing under the laws of the jurisdiction of its formation; (b) it has full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement; (c) in performing this Agreement and its obligations hereunder, it will comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations; and (d) the person signing this Agreement on its behalf

has been properly authorized and empowered to do so.

4.3. **By PolicyMap.** PolicyMap further represents, warrants, and covenants that to the best of its knowledge, it possesses (through ownership or grant of rights from its licensors) all intellectual property rights in the Data and Deliverables necessary to permit Subscriber to exercise all of the rights set forth in this Agreement, and that no third party shall have the right to claim payment, infringement, or other compensation for or limitation on use of the Data by Subscriber. PolicyMap makes reasonable efforts to remain compliant with Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. §794d), as amended. PolicyMap's sole liability and Subscriber's sole remedy for any breach of this warranty is PolicyMap's indemnification as stated in this Agreement.

4.4. **By Subscriber.** Subscriber further represents, warrants, and covenants that it (a) shall make no warranties about the Data that are greater or different from those made by PolicyMap; (b) shall not modify, make any new versions or derivative works of the Data; and (c) shall be responsible for all contracts and other agreements with Subscriber's Users and other third parties.

5. **Disclaimers and Limitations.**

5.1. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY STATED IN THIS AGREEMENT, THE DATA AND ALL OTHER DELIVERABLES, INFORMATION AND MATERIALS ARE PROVIDED TO SUBSCRIBER HEREUNDER STRICTLY ON AN "AS IS" AND "AS AVAILABLE" BASIS. POLICYMAP DISCLAIMS ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS AND IMPLIED, INCLUDING ANY WARRANTIES, REPRESENTATIONS OR PROMISES OF ORIGINALITY, MERCHANTABILITY, SUITABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, AS

WELL AS ANY WARRANTIES THAT THE DATA OR ANY OTHER INFORMATION OR MATERIALS PROVIDED TO SUBSCRIBER HEREUNDER WILL CONFORM TO ANY DESCRIPTION THEREOF OR BE FREE OF OMISSIONS, ERRORS, OR DEFECTS. THIS AGREEMENT DOES NOT LIMIT OR DISCLAIM ANY OF THE WARRANTIES SPECIFIED IN THE GSA SCHEDULE 70 CONTRACT UNDER FAR 52.212-4(O). IN THE EVENT OF A BREACH OF WARRANTY, THE U.S. GOVERNMENT RESERVES ALL RIGHTS AND REMEDIES UNDER THE CONTRACT, THE FEDERAL ACQUISITION REGULATIONS, AND THE CONTRACT DISPUTES ACT, 41 U.S.C. 7101-7109..

5.2. TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, AND NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING TO THE CONTRARY CONTAINED HEREIN, EACH PARTY WILL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY ONLY FOR DIRECT DAMAGES THAT PROXIMATELY RESULT FROM A BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT, AND NEITHER PARTY WILL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT, PUNITIVE OR SPECIAL DAMAGES, EVEN IF SUCH PARTY HAS BEEN APPRISED OF THE LIKELIHOOD OF SUCH DAMAGES. IN NO EVENT WILL EITHER PARTY'S AGGREGATE LIABILITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT EXCEED THE GREATER OF \$500,000 AND THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF THE LICENSE FEES PAID TO POLICYMAP BY SUBSCRIBER HEREUNDER DURING THE 12-MONTH PERIOD PRIOR TO THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO LIABILITY. FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBT, THESE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY INDEMNIFICATION CLAIMS RAISED BY THIRD PARTIES OR TO ANY VIOLATION OF THE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OR CONFIDENTIALITY PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT. THIS AGREEMENT SHALL NOT IMPAIR THE U.S. GOVERNMENT'S RIGHT TO RECOVER FOR FRAUD OR CRIMES ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS CONTRACT UNDER ANY FEDERAL FRAUD STATUTE, INCLUDING THE FALSE CLAIMS ACT, 31

U.S.C. 3729-3733. FURTHERMORE, THIS CLAUSE SHALL NOT IMPAIR NOR PREJUDICE THE U.S. GOVERNMENT'S RIGHT TO EXPRESS REMEDIES PROVIDED IN THE GSA SCHEDULE CONTRACT (E.G., CLAUSE 52.238-75 – PRICE REDUCTIONS, CLAUSE 52.212-4(H) – PATENT INDEMNIFICATION, AND GSAR 52.215-72 – PRICE ADJUSTMENT – FAILURE TO PROVIDE ACCURATE INFORMATION).

5.3. APPLICABLE LAW MAY NOT ALLOW THE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY SET FORTH ABOVE, SO THESE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY MAY NOT APPLY TO SUBSCRIBER.

5.4. THE DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES AND LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT ARE INDEPENDENT AND SHALL SURVIVE ANY FAILURE OF ANY REMEDY (EXCLUSIVE OR OTHERWISE).

6. **Payment Terms.**

6.1. **Invoices.** PolicyMap will invoice Subscriber in accordance with the Payment Terms outlined in the GSA Schedule contract and Order Form.

7. **Term and Termination.**

7.1. **Term.** Unless an applicable Order Form states otherwise, (a) this Agreement shall commence as of the Effective Date, and shall continue for a period of one year (the “**Initial Term**”), unless sooner terminated as set forth in the GSA Schedule contract; (b) this Agreement may be extended for successive one year terms thereafter (each, a “**Renewal Term**” and together with the Initial Term, the “**Term**”) upon the mutual agreement of the parties.

7.2. **Termination for Convenience.** See GSA Schedule contract.

7.3. **Termination for Breach.** See GSA Schedule contract.

7.4. **Termination for Insolvency.** See GSA Schedule contract.

7.5. **Effect of Termination.** Upon termination of this Agreement all rights of Subscriber and its Users to access and use the Data, the Deliverables and any other Services will cease, and Subscriber will cease to provide transactions that require the Data. Upon any such termination, Subscriber shall as promptly as reasonably possible return to PolicyMap or, at PolicyMap's option, destroy, all materials comprising, containing, or based on or derived from the Data, together with all complete or partial copies thereof in any medium, and Subscriber shall certify in writing to PolicyMap that such materials have been returned or destroyed. In addition, Subscriber shall take all reasonable steps required to ensure that all agreements with third parties then in effect with respect to the use by such third parties of the Data immediately terminate and Subscriber shall not renew any such agreements or solicit any third party to enter into any such agreement. The obligations of Subscriber under this paragraph shall not be affected by any dispute between the parties with respect to this Agreement or any other matter.

8. **Audit Right.** PolicyMap will have the right, to be exercised not more than once in any 12 month period, to audit Subscriber's books and records relevant to any data request transaction (“**Transactions Report**”) submitted hereunder. Any audit conducted hereunder will take place at Subscriber's offices only during Subscriber's normal business hours, consistent with all security measures of OA and upon at least 5 business days' prior notice to Subscriber. PolicyMap's audit right shall including the right to evaluate Subscriber's data and systems used

for tracking transactions and providing the Transactions Reports as well as the Data and related data of its Users. In addition, all information reviewed, obtained or otherwise learned by Subscriber in connection with its performance of any audit hereunder is and will remain the confidential information of Subscriber and its business partners (except for the confidential information of PolicyMap provided to Subscriber as stated in this Agreement). PolicyMap will only use such information in order to conduct its audit and review under this section, and under no circumstances will PolicyMap disclose this information to any third party or make any other use of this information whatsoever; provided however that PolicyMap shall be entitled to disclose such information to PolicyMap's legal and financial counsel that are from time-to-time retained by PolicyMap or as required by law or in connection with the prosecution or settlement of any bona fide dispute arising among the parties hereto.

9. **General Provisions.**

9.1. **Assignment.** Neither party may assign or subcontract any right in or obligation arising under this Agreement without the other party's prior written consent, not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed; provided, however, that in accordance with FAR 42.1204, a party will be entitled to assign this Agreement to an entity that acquires all or substantially all of that party's assets or business relating to the subject matter of this Agreement, and such assignment will be effective upon the assignee signing and providing to the other party a written acknowledgement that it is bound to all of the terms of this Agreement and each current Order Form. This Agreement will be binding on and inure to the benefit of each party's heirs, executors, legal representatives, successors and permitted assigns.

9.2. **Notices.** Except where provided otherwise, notices hereunder will be in writing and will be deemed to have been fully given and received when delivered by hand, sent by nationally recognized overnight courier, or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and properly addressed to the offices of the respective parties at the addresses set forth by the parties' signatures on the Order Form or such other address as one party may notify the other in accordance with the provisions of this Section.

9.3. **Survival.** The provisions of Sections 2.2, 3, 5, **Error! Reference source not found.**, 6, 7.5, 8 and 9, as well as any other terms of this Agreement that expressly extend or by their nature should extend beyond termination or expiration of this Agreement, will survive and continue in full force and effect after any termination or expiration of this Agreement.

9.4. **Publicity.** Neither party will issue any press release, public statement or other form of publicity relating to this Agreement or to the relationship of the parties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party.

9.5. **Governing Law.** United States federal law shall govern this Agreement, without reference to any conflicts of laws principles. The U.N. Convention on Contracts for the International Sales of Goods shall not apply to this Agreement.

9.6. **Modifications.** No modification or alteration of this Agreement will be effective unless made in writing (including by a new or revised Order Form) and signed by authorized representatives of PolicyMap and Subscriber. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such provision will be interpreted to the maximum extent to which it is valid and enforceable, all as determined by such

court in such action, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement will, nevertheless, continue in full force and effect without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

9.7. **Waiver.** No waiver by PolicyMap of compliance with or a breach of any provision of this Agreement will be valid unless provided in writing, and no individual waiver will constitute a continuing waiver of any provision of this Agreement.

9.8. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which will constitute an original and all of which together will constitute one instrument.

Exhibit**POLICYMAP
PLATFORM AVAILABILITY, SUPPORT AND DATA SECURITY**

“Platform Availability” means the percentage of hours in a calendar month that the Service is available, excluding scheduled maintenance and/or critical maintenance (“Maintenance”). PolicyMap will use reasonable efforts to make the Service available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, with the exception of Maintenance periods. PolicyMap will provide Subscriber notice of any Maintenance and will use reasonable efforts to limit extended periods of Maintenance to Saturdays and Sundays, between 11 pm and 2 am US Eastern time. Any Service downtime that is explicitly the responsibility of PolicyMap’s hosting provider (initially, Amazon), and is acknowledged by the hosting provider, counts as Maintenance time and not against the reimbursement schedule below.

If PolicyMap fails to meet the Platform Availability standards during any calendar month, then PolicyMap will provide Subscriber a credit as a percentage of that calendar month’s Service Fees (“Credit”) as shown below. Credits may only be applied against subsequent Service fees.

Statement on Data Security:

PolicyMap (which includes all Services including site licenses), and all associated data as of the Effective Date are hosted on Amazon's Web Services infrastructure, at a hosting facility located in Northern Virginia. Our database development group maintains the security of the Service production application and all associated data via firewall facilities provided by the Amazon Web Service. Only ports 80 and 443 are publicly accessible, which is consistent with standard implementation of World Wide Web protocols. The software delivering data from these ports is routinely scanned by Security Metrics for PCI compliance or compliance with similar metrics.

Administrative access to servers hosting the Service at the hosting provider is currently done through the Secure Shell program (also known as SSH) as of the Effective Date, which implements encrypted communication between the administrator and the machine being administered. The SSH server is the only mechanism for data to be uploaded to PolicyMap systems at the hosting provider, and also the only mechanism for direct administration of the hosting provider's environment. Access to the SSH server's port on all systems is strictly limited to the IP addresses of the PolicyMap offices in Philadelphia, Baltimore and Los Angeles, and the ability to access and use the SSH server is limited to those personnel having a need for such access. All development personnel are required to sign PolicyMap's form of nondisclosure agreement.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (SPECIAL ITEM NUMBER 132-51)**

*****NOTE: All non-professional labor categories must be incidental to, and used solely to support professional services, and cannot be purchased separately.**

1. SCOPE

- a. The prices, terms and conditions stated under Special Item Number 132-51 Information Technology Professional Services apply exclusively to IT Professional Services within the scope of this Information Technology Schedule.
- b. The Contractor shall provide services at the Contractor's facility and/or at the ordering activity location, as agreed to by the Contractor and the ordering activity.

2. PERFORMANCE INCENTIVES I-FSS-60 Performance Incentives (April 2000)

- a. Performance incentives may be agreed upon between the Contractor and the ordering activity on individual fixed price orders or Blanket Purchase Agreements under this contract.
- b. The ordering activity must establish a maximum performance incentive price for these services and/or total solutions on individual orders or Blanket Purchase Agreements.
- c. Incentives should be designed to relate results achieved by the contractor to specified targets. To the maximum extent practicable, ordering activities shall consider establishing incentives where performance is critical to the ordering activity's mission and incentives are likely to motivate the contractor. Incentives shall be based on objectively measurable tasks.

3. ORDER

- a. Agencies may use written orders, EDI orders, blanket purchase agreements, individual purchase orders, or task orders for ordering services under this contract. Blanket Purchase Agreements shall not extend beyond the end of the contract period; all services and delivery shall be made and the contract terms and conditions shall continue in effect until the completion of the order. Orders for tasks which extend beyond the fiscal year for which funds are available shall include FAR 52.232-19 (Deviation – May 2003) Availability of Funds for the Next Fiscal Year. The purchase order shall specify the availability of funds and the period for which funds are available.
- b. All task orders are subject to the terms and conditions of the contract. In the event of conflict between a task order and the contract, the contract will take precedence.

4. PERFORMANCE OF SERVICES

- a. The Contractor shall commence performance of services on the date agreed to by the Contractor and the ordering activity.

- b. The Contractor agrees to render services only during normal working hours, unless otherwise agreed to by the Contractor and the ordering activity.
- c. The ordering activity should include the criteria for satisfactory completion for each task in the Statement of Work or Delivery Order. Services shall be completed in a good and workmanlike manner.
- d. Any Contractor travel required in the performance of IT/IAM Services must comply with the Federal Travel Regulation or Joint Travel Regulations, as applicable, in effect on the date(s) the travel is performed. Established Federal Government per diem rates will apply to all Contractor travel. Contractors cannot use GSA city pair contracts.

5. STOP-WORK ORDER (FAR 52.242-15) (AUG 1989)

- (a) The Contracting Officer may, at any time, by written order to the Contractor, require the Contractor to stop all, or any part, of the work called for by this contract for a period of 90 days after the order is delivered to the Contractor, and for any further period to which the parties may agree. The order shall be specifically identified as a stop-work order issued under this clause. Upon receipt of the order, the Contractor shall immediately comply with its terms and take all reasonable steps to minimize the incurrence of costs allocable to the work covered by the order during the period of work stoppage. Within a period of 90 days after a stop-work is delivered to the Contractor, or within any extension of that period to which the parties shall have agreed, the Contracting Officer shall either-
 - (1) Cancel the stop-work order; or
 - (2) Terminate the work covered by the order as provided in the Default, or the Termination for Convenience of the Government, clause of this contract.
- (b) If a stop-work order issued under this clause is canceled or the period of the order or any extension thereof expires, the Contractor shall resume work. The Contracting Officer shall make an equitable adjustment in the delivery schedule or contract price, or both, and the contract shall be modified, in writing, accordingly, if-
 - (1) The stop-work order results in an increase in the time required for, or in the Contractor's cost properly allocable to, the performance of any part of this contract; and
 - (2) The Contractor asserts its right to the adjustment within 30 days after the end of the period of work stoppage; provided, that, if the Contracting Officer decides the facts justify the action, the Contracting Officer may receive and act upon the claim submitted at any time before final payment under this contract.
- (c) If a stop-work order is not canceled and the work covered by the order is terminated for the convenience of the Government, the Contracting Officer shall allow reasonable costs resulting from the stop-work order in arriving at the termination settlement.
- (d) If a stop-work order is not canceled and the work covered by the order is terminated for default, the Contracting Officer shall allow, by equitable adjustment or otherwise, reasonable costs resulting from the stop-work order.

6. INSPECTION OF SERVICES

In accordance with FAR 52.212-4 CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS--COMMERCIAL ITEMS (MAR 2009) (DEVIATION I - FEB 2007) for Firm-Fixed Price orders and FAR 52.212-4 CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS COMMERCIAL ITEMS (MAR 2009) (ALTERNATE I OCT 2008) (DEVIATION I – FEB 2007) applies to Time-and-Materials and Labor-Hour Contracts orders placed under this contract.

7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall comply with all laws, ordinances, and regulations (Federal, State, City, or otherwise) covering work of this character. If the end product of a task order is software, then FAR 52.227-14 (Dec 2007) Rights in Data – General, may apply.

8. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ORDERING ACTIVITY

Subject to security regulations, the ordering activity shall permit Contractor access to all facilities necessary to perform the requisite IT Professional Services.

9. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

All IT Professional Services performed by the Contractor under the terms of this contract shall be as an independent Contractor, and not as an agent or employee of the ordering activity.

10. ORGANIZATIONAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

a. Definitions.

“Contractor” means the person, firm, unincorporated association, joint venture, partnership, or corporation that is a party to this contract.

“Contractor and its affiliates” and “Contractor or its affiliates” refers to the Contractor, its chief executives, directors, officers, subsidiaries, affiliates, subcontractors at any tier, and consultants and any joint venture involving the Contractor, any entity into or with which the Contractor subsequently merges or affiliates, or any other successor or assignee of the Contractor.

An “Organizational conflict of interest” exists when the nature of the work to be performed under a proposed ordering activity contract, without some restriction on ordering activities by the Contractor and its affiliates, may either (i) result in an unfair competitive advantage to the Contractor or its affiliates or (ii) impair the Contractor’s or its affiliates’ objectivity in performing contract work.

b. To avoid an organizational or financial conflict of interest and to avoid prejudicing the best interests of the ordering activity, ordering activities may place restrictions on the Contractors, its affiliates, chief executives, directors, subsidiaries and subcontractors at any tier when placing orders against schedule contracts. Such restrictions shall be consistent with FAR 9.505 and shall be designed to

avoid, neutralize, or mitigate organizational conflicts of interest that might otherwise exist in situations related to individual orders placed against the schedule contract. Examples of situations, which may require restrictions, are provided at FAR 9.508.

11. INVOICES

The Contractor, upon completion of the work ordered, shall submit invoices for IT Professional services. Progress payments may be authorized by the ordering activity on individual orders if appropriate. Progress payments shall be based upon completion of defined milestones or interim products. Invoices shall be submitted monthly for recurring services performed during the preceding month.

12. PAYMENTS

For firm-fixed price orders the ordering activity shall pay the Contractor, upon submission of proper invoices or vouchers, the prices stipulated in this contract for service rendered and accepted. Progress payments shall be made only when authorized by the order. For time-and-materials orders, the Payments under Time-and-Materials and Labor-Hour Contracts at FAR 52.212-4 (MAR 2009) (ALTERNATE I – OCT 2008) (DEVIATION I – FEB 2007) applies to time-and-materials orders placed under this contract. For labor-hour orders, the Payment under Time-and-Materials and Labor-Hour Contracts at FAR 52.212-4 (MAR 2009) (ALTERNATE I – OCT 2008) (DEVIATION I – FEB 2007) applies to labor-hour orders placed under this contract. 52.216-31(Feb 2007) Time-and-Materials/Labor-Hour Proposal Requirements—Commercial Item Acquisition As prescribed in 16.601(e)(3), insert the following provision:

- (a) The Government contemplates award of a Time-and-Materials or Labor-Hour type of contract resulting from this solicitation.
- (b) The offeror must specify fixed hourly rates in its offer that include wages, overhead, general and administrative expenses, and profit. The offeror must specify whether the fixed hourly rate for each labor category applies to labor performed by—
 - (1) The offeror;
 - (2) Subcontractors; and/or
 - (3) Divisions, subsidiaries, or affiliates of the offeror under a common control.

13. RESUMES

Resumes shall be provided to the GSA Contracting Officer or the user ordering activity upon request.

14. INCIDENTAL SUPPORT COSTS

Incidental support costs are available outside the scope of this contract. The costs will be negotiated separately with the ordering activity in accordance with the guidelines set forth in the FAR.

15. APPROVAL OF SUBCONTRACTS

The ordering activity may require that the Contractor receive, from the ordering activity's Contracting Officer, written consent before placing any subcontract for furnishing any of the work called for in a task order.

16. DESCRIPTION OF IT PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AND PRICING

a. The Contractor shall provide a description of each type of IT Service offered under Special Item Numbers 132-51 IT Professional Services should be presented in the same manner as the Contractor sells to its commercial and other ordering activity customers. If the Contractor is proposing hourly rates, a description of all corresponding commercial job titles (labor categories) for those individuals who will perform the service should be provided.

b. Pricing for all IT Professional Services shall be in accordance with the Contractor's customary commercial practices; e.g., hourly rates, monthly rates, term rates, and/or fixed prices, minimum general experience and minimum education.
