621-001 Physician – General and Family Practice

Years of Experience: Minimum twelve months experience post residency.

Minimum Education: Medical School (MD or DO); Residency; ACGME approved residency program

Licensure: Valid license for State of work, Territories, or Commonwealth

Certification: Board Certified or eligible.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include prescribing or administering treatment, therapy, medication, vaccination, and other specialized medical care to treat or prevent illness, disease, or injury. Order, perform, and interpret tests and analyze records, reports, and examination information to diagnose patients' condition. Collect, record, and maintain patient information, such as medical history, reports, and examination results. Monitor patients' conditions and progress and reevaluate treatments as necessary. Consult with practitioners and other specialty medical doctors.

621-005 Physician – OB/GYN (Obstetrics and Gynecology)

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post residency

Minimum Education: Medical School (MD or DO); ACGME approved residency program

Licensure: Valid license for State of work, Territories, or Commonwealth

Certification: Board Certified or eligible. Basic Life Support and Advanced Cardiac Life Support required.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include collecting, recording, and maintaining patient information, such as medical histories, reports, and examination results. Treat diseases of female organs. Care for and treat women during prenatal, natal, and postnatal periods. Prescribe or administer therapy, medication, and other specialized medical care to treat or prevent illness, disease, or injury. Perform cesarean sections or other surgical procedures as needed to preserve patients' health and deliver babies safely. Analyze records, reports, test results, or examination information to diagnose medical condition of patient. Explain procedures and discuss test results or prescribed treatments with patients. Monitor patients' conditions and progress and reevaluate treatments as necessary. Advise patients and community members concerning diet, activity, hygiene, and disease prevention. Refer patient to medical specialist or other practitioner when necessary.

621-010 Physician - Neurologist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post residency

Minimum Education: Medical School (MD or DO); ACGME approved residency program

Licensure: Valid license for State of work, Territories, or Commonwealth

Certification: Board Certified or eligible. Basic Life Support and Advanced Cardiac Life Support required.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include interviewing patients to obtain information such as complaints, symptoms, medical histories, and family histories. Examine patients to obtain information about functional status of areas such as vision, physical strength, coordination, reflexes, sensations, language skills, cognitive abilities, and mental status. Perform or interpret the outcomes of procedures or diagnostic tests such as lumbar punctures, electroencephalography, electromyography, and nerve conduction velocity tests. Order or interpret results of laboratory analyses of patients' blood or cerebrospinal fluid. Diagnose neurological conditions based on interpretation of examination findings, histories, or test results. Prescribe or administer medications, such as anti-epileptic drugs, and monitor patients for behavioral and cognitive side effects. Identify and treat major neurological system diseases and



disorders such as central nervous system infection, cranio spinal trauma, dementia, and stroke. Develop treatment plans based on diagnoses and on evaluation of factors such as age and general health, or procedural risks and costs. Inform patients or families of neurological diagnoses and prognoses, or benefits, risks and costs of various treatment plans. Prepare, maintain, or review records that include patients' histories, neurological examination findings, treatment plans, or outcomes. Communicate with other health care professionals regarding patients' conditions and care. Counsel patients or others on the background of neurological disorders including risk factors, or genetic or environmental concerns. Interpret the results of neuroimaging studies such as Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI), Single Photon Emission Computed Tomography (SPECT), and Positron Emission Tomography (PET) scans. Coordinate neurological services with other health care team activities. Refer patients to other health care practitioners as necessary. Advise other physicians on the treatment of neurological problems. Participate in continuing education activities to maintain and expand competence. Order supportive care services such as physical therapy, specialized nursing care, and social services. Supervise medical technicians in the performance of neurological diagnostic or therapeutic activities.

621-018 Physician – Psychologist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience

Minimum Education: Need at a minimum of a Master's in Psychology. Preferably a Doctorate Degree

License: Current, active, valid, and unrestricted license from a U.S. State; must be board certified in an appropriate specialty.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include interacting with clients to assist them in gaining insight, defining goals, and planning action to achieve effective personal, social, educational, and vocational development and adjustment. Identify psychological, emotional, or behavioral issues and diagnose disorders, using information obtained from interviews, tests, records, and reference materials. Use a variety of treatment methods, such as psychotherapy, hypnosis, behavior modification, stress reduction therapy, psychodrama, and play therapy. Counsel individuals and groups regarding problems, such as stress, substance abuse, and family situations, to modify behavior or to improve personal, social, and vocational adjustment. Discuss the treatment of problems with clients.

621-021 Physician – Gastroenterologist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post residency

Minimum Education: Graduate from an accredited Medical School and residency/fellowship program. (Includes: General; Colon and Rectal; Plastic; Thoracic/Vascular; Neurosurgery; Cardio Thoracic)

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include following established surgical techniques during the operation. Examine patient to obtain information on medical condition and surgical risk. Operate on patients to correct deformities, repair injuries, prevent and treat diseases, or improve or restore patients' functions. Analyze patient's medical history, medication allergies, physical condition, and examination results to verify operation's necessity and to determine best procedure. Prescribe preoperative and postoperative treatments and procedures, such as sedatives, diets, antibiotics, and preparation and treatment of the patient's operative area. Diagnose bodily disorders and orthopedic conditions and provide treatments, such as medicines and surgeries, in clinics, hospital wards, and operating rooms. Provide consultation and surgical assistance to other physicians and surgeons. Refer patient to medical specialist or other practitioners when necessary. Prepare case histories. Manage surgery services, including planning, scheduling and coordination, determination of procedures, and procurement of



supplies and equipment. Examine instruments, equipment, and operating room to ensure sterility.

621-025 Registered Nurses (Includes General and Specialized)

Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and implement nursing care plans, and maintain medical records. Administer nursing care to ill, injured, convalescent, or disabled patients. May advise patients on health maintenance and disease prevention or provide case management. Licensing or registration required. Advanced practice nursing is practiced by RNs who have specialized formal, post-basic education and who function in highly autonomous and specialized roles. Requires State Certification; Associates Degree; Bachelor's Degree. Years of experience dependent on work requirements

621-027 Pharmacist – General/Pharm D (Doctor of Pharmacy)

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post residency licensure

Minimum Education: RPh or PharmD Degree preferred.

Licensure: Unrestricted state licensure

Certifications: Specific Certification(s) as required by using agency's inclusion in the Statement of Work/Performance Work Statement (i.e. BLS, ACLS, PALS, NRP, etc.).

References: Minimum of three (3) professional references

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include reviewing prescriptions to assure accuracy, to ascertain the needed ingredients, and to evaluate their suitability. Provide information and advice regarding drug interactions, side effects, dosage, and proper medication storage. Maintain records, such as pharmacy files, patient profiles, charge system files, inventories, control records for radioactive nuclei, or registries of poisons, narcotics, or controlled drugs. Plan, implement, or maintain procedures for mixing, packaging, or labeling pharmaceuticals, according to policy and legal requirements, to ensure quality, security, and proper disposal. Assess the identity, strength, or purity of medications. Collaborate with other health care professionals to plan, monitor, review, or evaluate the quality or effectiveness of drugs or drug regimens, providing advice on drug applications or characteristics. Order and purchase pharmaceutical supplies, medical supplies, or drugs, maintaining stock and storing and handling it properly. Analyze prescribing trends to monitor patient compliance and to prevent excessive usage or harmful interactions. Compound and dispense medications as prescribed by doctors and dentists, by calculating, weighing, measuring, and mixing ingredients, or oversee these activities. Provide specialized services to help patients manage conditions such as diabetes, asthma, smoking cessation, or high blood pressure. Refer patients to other health professionals or agencies when appropriate. Update or troubleshoot pharmacy information databases.

621-031 Audiologist/Speech Language Pathologist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post licensure

Minimum Education: Master's Degree in speech pathology. Current license issued by State of work.

Certifications: Must possess a BLS certification

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include monitoring patients' progress and adjust treatments accordingly. Develop or implement treatment plans for problems such as stuttering, delayed language, swallowing disorders, or inappropriate pitch or harsh voice problems, based on own assessments and recommendations of physicians, psychologists, or social workers. Write reports and maintain proper documentation of information, such as client Medicaid or billing records or caseload activities, including the initial evaluation, treatment, progress, and discharge of clients. Participate in and write reports for meetings regarding patients' progress, such as individualized educational planning (IEP) meetings, in-service meetings, or intervention assistance team meetings. Evaluate hearing or speech and language test results, barium



swallow results, or medical or background information to diagnose and plan treatment for speech, language, fluency, voice, or swallowing disorders. Complete administrative responsibilities, such as coordinating paperwork, scheduling case management activities, or writing lesson plans. Develop individual or group activities or programs to deal with behavior, speech, language, or swallowing problems. Instruct clients in techniques for more effective communication, such as sign language, lip reading, or voice improvement. Administer hearing or speech and language evaluations, tests, or examinations to patients to collect information on type and degree of impairments, using written or oral tests or special instruments. Educate patients and family members about various topics, such as communication techniques or strategies to cope with or to avoid personal misunderstandings. Supervise or collaborate with therapy team. Teach clients to control or strengthen tongue, jaw, face muscles, or breathing mechanisms. Use computer applications to identify or assist with communication disabilities.

621-033 Dental – Dental Hygienist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience practicing as a dental assistant and must possess a certification as a dental assistant.

Minimum Education: Must possess a high school diploma or GED.

Certifications: Be certified as a dental assistant and certified in expanded functions. Must possess a BLS certification and have knowledge of routine office related duties including working knowledge of computers and word processing programs.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include preparing patients, sterilizing or disinfecting instruments, setting up instrument trays, preparing materials, or assist dentist during dental procedures. Record treatment information in patient records. Expose dental diagnostic x-rays. Take and record medical and dental histories and vital signs of patients. Assist dentist in management of medical or dental emergencies. Provide postoperative instructions prescribed by dentist, instruct patients in oral hygiene and plaque control programs. Order and monitor dental supplies and equipment inventory. Fabricate temporary restorations or custom impressions from preliminary impressions. Pour, trim, and polish study casts, clean and polish removable appliances, clean teeth, using dental instruments. Schedule appointments, prepare bills and receive payment for dental services, complete insurance forms, and maintain records, manually or using computer.

621-035 Physical Therapy – Physical Therapist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post licensure

Minimum Education: Must have a Master's Degree from an accredited program and be certified as a Physical Therapist

Certifications: Possess a BLS certification

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include planning, preparing, or carrying out individually designed programs of physical treatment to maintain, improve, or restore physical functioning, alleviate pain, or prevent physical dysfunction in patients. Perform and document an initial exam, evaluating data to identify problems and determine a diagnosis prior to intervention. Evaluate effects of treatment at various stages and adjust treatments to achieve maximum benefit. Identify and document goals, anticipated progress, and plans for reevaluation. Record prognosis, treatment, response, and progress in patient's chart or enter information into computer. Obtain patients' informed consent to proposed interventions. Test and measure patient's strength, motor development and function, sensory perception, functional capacity, or respiratory or circulatory efficiency and record data. Review physician's referral and patient's medical records to help determine diagnosis and physical therapy treatment required. Discharge patient from physical therapy when goals or projected outcomes have been attained and provide for appropriate follow-up care or referrals. Instruct patient and family in treatment procedures to be continued at home. Administer manual exercises, massage, or traction to help



relieve pain, increase patient strength, or decrease or prevent deformity or crippling. Provide information to the patient about the proposed intervention, its material risks and expected benefits, and any reasonable alternatives.

621-037 Occupational Therapy – Occupational Therapist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post licensure

Minimum Education: Must have a Master's Degree from an accredited program and be certified as an Occupational Therapist

Certifications: Possess a BLS certification

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include completing and maintaining necessary records. Test and evaluate patients' physical and mental abilities and analyze medical data to determine realistic rehabilitation goals for patients. Evaluate patients' progress and prepare reports that detail progress. Plan, organize, and conduct occupational therapy programs in hospital, institutional, or community settings to help rehabilitate those impaired because of illness, injury or psychological or developmental problems. Select activities that will help individuals learn work and life-management skills within limits of their mental or physical capabilities. Recommend changes in patients' work or living environments, consistent with their needs and capabilities. Design and create, or requisition, special supplies and equipment, such as splints, braces, and computer-aided adaptive equipment. Develop and participate in health promotion programs, group activities, or discussions to promote client health, facilitate social adjustment, alleviate stress, and prevent physical or mental disability.

621-038 LP/VN (Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurse)

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post licensure

Minimum Education: Must have a high school diploma or GED and be a graduate of an accredited LPN program.

Certifications: Possess a BLS certification

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include administering prescribed medications or starting intravenous fluids, noting times and amounts on patients' charts. Observe patients, charting and reporting changes in patients' conditions, such as adverse reactions to medication or treatment, and taking any necessary action. Answer patients' calls and determine how to assist them. Measure and record patients' vital signs, such as height, weight, temperature, blood pressure, pulse, and respiration. Provide basic patient care or treatments, such as taking temperatures or blood pressures, dressing wounds, treating bedsores, giving enemas or douches, rubbing with alcohol, massaging, or performing catheterizations. Work as part of a healthcare team to assess patient needs, plan and modify care, and implement interventions. Supervise nurses' aides or assistants. Assemble and use equipment, such as catheters, tracheotomy tubes, or oxygen suppliers. Record food and fluid intake and output. Collect samples, such as blood, urine, or sputum from patients, and perform routine laboratory tests on samples. Prepare patients for examinations, tests, or treatments and explain procedures. Sterilize equipment and supplies, using germicides, sterilizer, or autoclave. Make appointments, keep records, or perform other clerical duties in doctors' offices or clinics. Set up equipment and prepare medical treatment rooms. Inventory and requisition supplies and instruments.

621-040 Nurse Assistant (Certified, Registered)

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience post licensure

Minimum Education: Must have a High School Diploma or GED and be a graduate from an accredited nursing assistant program.

Certifications: Possess a CPR certification. Must have CNA certification.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include answering patient call signals, signal lights, bells, or intercom systems to determine patients' needs. Turn or reposition bedridden patients.



Provide physical support to assist patients to perform daily living activities. Review patients' dietary restrictions, food allergies, and preferences to ensure patient receives appropriate diet. Measure and record food and liquid intake or urinary and fecal output, reporting changes to medical or nursing staff. Record vital signs, such as temperature, blood pressure, pulse, or respiration rate, as directed by medical or nursing staff. Gather information from caregivers, nurses, or physicians about patient condition, treatment plans. Document or otherwise report observations of patient behavior, complaints, or physical symptoms to nurses. Remind patients to take medications or nutritional supplements. Assist nurses or physicians in the operation of medical equipment or provision of patient care.

621-044 Ophthalmic – Assistant/Technician

Years of Experience in Specialty: Minimum of twelve months experience in their respective specialty.

Minimum Education: High School diploma, Two year Training & certification program

State Licensure: Requirements vary per state

Certification: JCAHOP required BCLS: Required

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include conducting tonometry or tonography tests to measure intraocular pressure. Measure visual acuity, including near, distance, pinhole, or dynamic visual acuity, using appropriate tests. Take and document patients' medical histories. Administer topical ophthalmic or oral medications. Conduct visual field tests to measure field of vision. Operate ophthalmic equipment, such as autorefractors, phoropters, tomographs, or retinoscopes. Clean or sterilize ophthalmic or surgical instruments. Call patients to inquire about their post-operative status or recovery.

621-046 Laboratory – Clinical Laboratory Technician (Certified, Associate's Degree)

Years of Experience in Specialty: Minimum of twelve months experience

Minimum Education: Associate's Degree

Minimum Training: Twelve month on the job supervised training

Certification: ASCP or NAACLS

State Licensure: Not required

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include conducting chemical analyses of body fluids, such as blood or urine, using microscope or automatic analyzer to detect abnormalities or diseases and enter findings into computer. Analyze the results of tests or experiments to ensure conformity to specifications, using special mechanical or electrical devices. Set up, maintain, calibrate, clean, and test sterility of medical laboratory equipment. Prepare standard volumetric solutions or reagents to be combined with samples, following standardized formulas or experimental procedures. Collect blood or tissue samples from patients, observing principles of asepsis to obtain blood sample.

621-047 Counselor – Social Work (Graduate Degree)

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months experience equivalent to the next lower grade level.

Minimum Education: Applicants must have successfully completed a course of study in an accredited School of Social Work and have fulfilled all the requirements for the Master's Degree

State Licensure: Applicants must be a Licensed Independent Social Worker (LICSW) in the District of Columbia. A copy of the Master's degree and license must accompany the application for the position.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include collaborating with other professionals to evaluate patients' medical or physical condition and to assess client needs. Advocate for clients or patients to resolve crises. Refer patient, client, or family to community resources to assist in



recovery from mental or physical illness and to provide access to services such as financial assistance, legal aid, housing, job placement or education. Investigate child abuse or neglect cases and take authorized protective action when necessary. Counsel clients and patients in individual and group sessions to help them overcome dependencies, recover from illness, and adjust to life.

621-048 Dietitian – Nutritionist

Years of Experience: Minimum of twelve months of experience post licensure as a dietitian preferred

Minimum Education: Bachelor's degree in nutrition/dietetics

Registrations: Registered Dietitian with the Commission on Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association or registry eligible.

Memberships: Membership in the American Dietetic Association strongly preferred ServSafe Food Safety Certification preferred.

Functional Responsibility: Job duties may include monitoring food service operations to ensure conformance to nutritional, safety, sanitation and quality standards. Assess nutritional needs, diet restrictions and current health plans to develop and implement dietary-care plans and provide nutritional counseling. Advise patients and their families on nutritional principles, dietary plans and diet modifications, and food selection and preparation.
